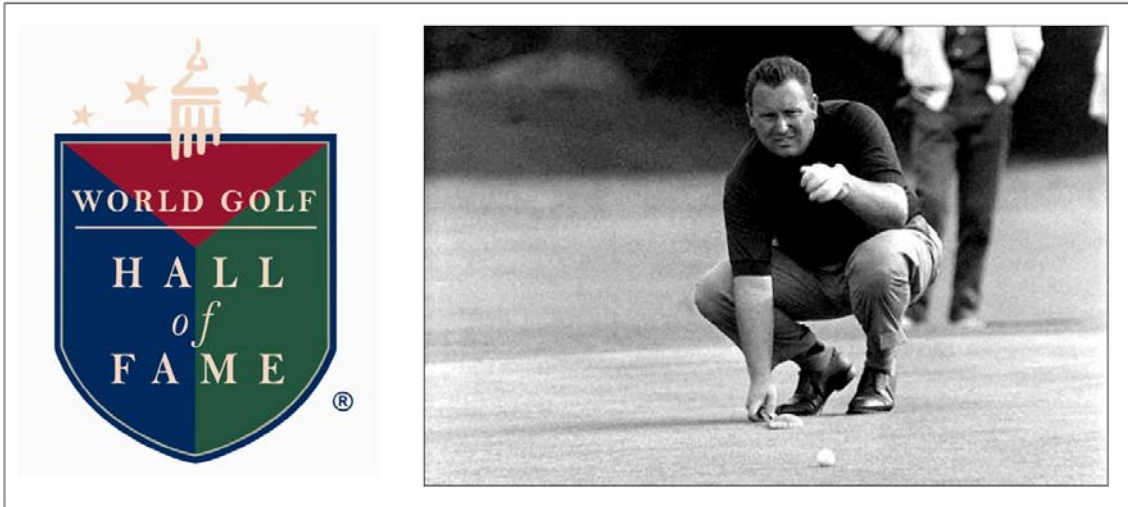


Billy Casper



ABOUT BILLY CASPER

In 2000, Billy Casper was ranked as the 15th greatest golfer of all time by Golf Digest magazine.

Casper was named “One of the most prolific tournament winners ever to compete on the PGA Tour”

Between 1964 and 1970, Casper won 27 tournaments on the PGA Tour, which was more than legends Jack Nicklaus, Arnold Palmer, and Gary Player did during that time period.

ACCOLADES:

- World Gold Hall of Fame
- One of only 2 Hall of Fame Members to win 5 Vardon Trophies (Billy Casper, Lee Travino)
- Finished 1st of the Champions Tour 9 Times
- Golfers with most PGA Tour wins: 51 PGA TOUR WINS
- Listed 7th of all time list of golfers with Most Major Championship Wins and Most PGA Tour Wins

- Three major championships: the 1959 and 1966 U.S. Opens, and the 1970 Masters Tournament
- PGA Tour Money Winner in 1966 and 1968.
- PGA Player of the Year in 1966 and 1970.
- Won the Vardon Trophy for lowest scoring average five times: 1960, 1963, 1965, 1966, and 1968.
- Member of the United States team in the Ryder Cup 8 times -- in 1961, 1963, 1965, 1967, 1969, 1971, 1973, 1975, and a non-playing captain in 1979. Casper has scored the most points in the Ryder Cup by an American player.
- Nine Senior PGA Tour (now the Champions Tour) wins from 1982 to 1989, including two senior majors.
- Inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 1978.
- Casper captained the U.S. Ryder Cup team in 1979 and was considered the best putter of the era.
- Billy Casper and his wife are very active in charitable work for children and hosts fundraisers including an annual tournament at San Diego Country Club for "Billy's Kids".
